The Star and Atom is the youngest club in S. H. S. It was formed last February by several students who were interested in science. The object of the club is to promote research on current scientific matters.

The club has been nicknamed "The Aristocracy of Brains" inasmuch as a high standard of scholarship is necessary for membership to the society. The membership is also limited to members of either chemistry or physics classes. The scholarship is at least ninety percent in the scientific subject being carried and at least eighty percent in all other subjects.

A great interest was immediately taken in the club which now has forty names on its roll. Such subjects as "Abrams Theory of Electronic Medicine," "Biological Evolution," "Spiritualism," and "Atomic Stru ture" have been discussed in the

different programs. The usual program is made up of a twenty minute paper by one member, while a leading discussion of about ten minutes is taken by another member. Different members are also called upon to comment on the subject. In connection with the program on "Abrams Theory of Electronic Medicine" a visit was made to the office of Dr. R. L. Brown, who practices Electronic Medicine, where a demonstration of the theory was given.

Officers for the coming year were not elected this year, but will be elected at the first meeting. As a whole the club has been a great success this year, and it promises to be a leader among the societies next year.

That the club has been a success has been largely due to the supervision of the faculty advisers, Mr. Conover, Mr. Stevens, Mr. Kuhns, and Mr. Eckert.
